### **Future for Healthcare**

We were surprised and disappointed after the Health Boards decision to accept, without question, the recommendation of the Citizen's Jury that the eventual replacement for the two existing hospitals should be placed at an uspecified site in Cinderford.

However, there is a long way to go until a new Hospital is built – the site has to be found, purchase negotiated, planning permission obtained, plans drawn up and the facility commissioned – many years.....

In the meantime.....

...we are working in two main areas:-

- 1. To maintain existing services until new provisions are made.
- 2. To develop a new 'Health Hub' for the ever-growing population in the south of the Forest.

We have had meetings with MP Mark Harper, Lydney Town Council, and other local partners, as well as Health Authorities and providers.

The Town council have put formal questions to the County Council Scrutiny Committee which we hope will draw the attention to the huge gap in health care that is going to emerge in the everincreasing population in the south of the forest.

Mark Harper will be following our call to ensure that existing services remain until any future health provision is actually commissioned and running. We do not want local services to be stopped with the promise that they will be restored in the future, as this is so often does not happen.

Our objective would be to have an integrated health centre in the South Forest which would include an urgent care centre, diagnostics, outpatients appointments, x ray facilities, the services from local GP's and other related bodies, together with social care and mental health facilites – in other words a complete health 'one stop shop' (healthcare and wellbeing centre)

(Ideally this should indicate a psotive platform for communitybased services and can serve the role as a hub for integrated health and social care).
